

Home Learning

Home Learning

- Supports children's learning at school
- Extends the learning they are doing in school
- Allows them to practise and revisit areas of learning that need to be known by heart
- Lets parents support children with their learning at home

Nursery

- Share a book every day with your child including the weekly library book
- Talk about and bring in items, as requested, for the colour and sound table
- Support them in completing Home Learning tasks

Reception and Year 1

- Share a book every day, this might be their reading book, library book or a book from home
- Play the maths game
- Use the Maths Activity Book (Year 1 only)
- Share and read the key words for the phonic phase they are working in
- From the end of phonic phase 5, children will have 3-5 spellings linked to the spelling patterns being taught in phonic sessions
- Support them in completing Home Learning tasks

Year 2 and Year 3

- Share reading books, library books or books from home every day
- Help them learn their key words from the phonic phase
- Weekly spellings linked to the spelling patterns being taught in phonic sessions
- Practise their times tables regularly (2, 5, and 10 in Y2 and 3, 4 and 8 in Y3)
- Play the maths game
- Use the Maths Activity Book (Y2 only in the first term)
- Support them in completing Home Learning tasks which will be linked to different curriculum areas including mathematics and Literacy

Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6

- Hear them read and discuss their reading or library books
- Help them with vocabulary and word based activities which will include spelling investigations
- Practise times tables (6, 7 and 9 in Y4 and have fluent recall to 12x12 in Y5 and Y6)
- Play the maths game
- Support them in completing Home Learning tasks. These may be short, focused tasks for Literacy and maths linked to that week's learning or they may relate to broader curriculum topics that are being covered in science, history, geography or RE.

Greenfields website has information on topics covered over the school year and topic curriculum maps. A class timetable is also on the website to keep track of the days each class will be changing reading books, library books and maths games.

There are also links to Espresso and Education City where you will find lots of age appropriate activities to support your child's learning.
