EU will be teaching the children so much more than music however, their ethos is about inclusivity, achievability and celebrating everyone's uniqueness — values that really match what Greenfields is all about.

Healthy Packed Lunches

This week I feel I need to remind parents as to what food can be sent into school in a packed lunch box, and our need to keep all children safe in school. We have several children with sever nut allergies, so nuts and nut products are a complete NO, and must not be sent into school. This includes checkging that products do not have nuts in them, like chocolate spread. I have also been shocked to see chocolate bars and sweets appearing in lunch boxes in the dining hall – these are not allowed, and never have been, Please do not send them in. If we see children with them, they will be told not to eat them at lunch and to take them home.

Lunch is a really important meal and needs to give the children the long burning calories that will get them to the end of the day, not fast burning sugary items which increase poor behaviour choices and then lead to a slump as the initial high wears off.

Sandwiches, pasta, wraps, pastries are all fine. Salads, fruit and vegetables: great.

It is only at lunch that children should have any other drink to water. Classroom water bottle should only contain water, and children can bring in squash or smoothie type drinks for lunch. There is so much research into why water is best during the day for the brain, and we need to give our children the best opportunities to do as well as they can.

Please support us by ensuring their lunch follows the expectations we have in school. Thank you.

Roofing Update

One month in and the roof project is still going – causing all sorts of noises and interruptions to our days, but we are getting there. You will have noticed now we still have people on the roof, and now a new team working on drains, so sometimes school is a bit smelly, and there is a lot of mud around! We are all doing the best we can, and the men are on target despite the really cold and wet weather.

Next week they will be working across the front of school, so access to the main front door will be slightly different and channeled rather than just walk up to it, but you will be able to get to us. I just ask that those who gather at the front door be mindful of the limited space, and for those who bring bikes, scooters and buggies to leave them tidily in the bike shed rather than just left on the ground.

For next week, we ask that Y₄ use the field side entrance and exit until the front door is clear again. Many thanks for your support in this.

Children: £10 a ticket


Adults: £12.50
