This data is for the  $30^{th}$  October –  $3^{rd}$  November, and I am very pleased with 5 classes having attendance in line or better than the national data. This week is a very different story, with lots of temperatures and sickness bugs – the start of the illness season is upon us. Please keep your child at home if they have sickness or diarrhoea for 48 hours. Colds are down to your knowledge of your child – but a cough or a sniffle does not stop them learning. Please believe me when I say we will send your child home if they are not well enough to learn, but a sore throat does not stop them learning.


We still have a number of families struggling with being in school on time however. Please can every family try to be in school by 8.40am. Registers are taken at 8.45am and the first 15 minutes are used to catch up on misunderstandings from the previous days' learning, fine motor work, handwriting and just settling down to be ready for lessons. It makes a real difference to the children. Being late by 15 minutes a day means that by the end of the year a children would have missed the equivalent of 2 weeks of school. Please be in and on time!

### Winter uniform needs

As the weather become worse – it definitely is autumn now – children need to ensure they have a coat every day. Even in rain, we do try to get the children outside to play, but only if they have a coat with them. There have been several children this week who have not been able to go out to play because they didn't have a coat. Please make sure they arrive wearing one!

We also have lots of children in sweatshirts which are not green or not school uniform. As it is colder, I appreciate the need for more layers, but please adhere to our uniform policy – a dark green sweatshirt. Not blue, grey or black. If your child is going to take this off in school, please ensure their name is in it, so when they leave it around the building we can return it to them. Ideally label the collar not the clothing labels, as these cannot be cut out.

If you are sending in gloves and scarves etc, please ensure these are named too.

#### Year 3 news

On Monday, we went on a trip to the Natural History Museum to see the earthquake and volcano exhibition. We went by coach because it was in London.

First, we went to the exhibit and we went up an escalator, which took us inside a planet. It looked like it was made of gold foil and metal. It felt like we were inside the planet's core.

Next, we went inside a fake supermarket and the floor started to shake, to show what it would be like in a real earthquake. It was amazing, the wall looked like it was about to fall down and the food and drinks started to shake on the shelves. It was based on the Kobe earthquake in Japan in 1995. It showed us real footage of the earthquake on a little TV screen.

We saw a big screen that showed us all the different types of volcanoes, like mega volcanoes and ones that did not erupt but smoke came out of them.

In the Earths Treasures section, we saw some beautiful shiny crystals. There were many different colours, but the most popular colours were red and purple.

When we went to the dinosaur section, we were shocked by the size of bones and by the moving, roaring dinosaurs. When we saw the life size, moving T-rex and we thought that it might be real, but it was just a robot. We saw an enormous T-rex heart the size of a basketball.

We had a fantastic day out and really enjoyed ourselves. On the way out, we bought a dinosaur Santa to go on the top of Year 3's Christmas tree.

Some of us fell asleep on the way home, but most of us were wide awake from an exciting day.
