



#### Safety on site

As the evenings are warmer I know there is the temptation to let children play on site after we have released the children into your care. It is very easy to stand and chat to other friends whilst the children play on the grounds. However, from the moment we hand them over to you, their safety is your responsibility. We have recently had a few smaller children wander off from their adults, who have not noticed they have gone; and we have had accidents where children are using equipment that is not the right size for them. The KS2 equipment is on KS2 for a reason, and should not be used by children under 7.

Please be vigilant and ensure you have sight of all your children after school. Children cannot play on site without a responsible adult present. Thank you.

Sports Day is a rite of passage in all Primary Schools and pretty much every adult remembers their school Sports Days. However, recent years have made the traditional element of Sports Day harder and harder to manage, with parents simply not listening to staff, staying where asked, and obstructing the running of the day either through their behaviour or their comments about other children, or simply being rude to each other. So much so, that we now have many children who refuse to take part in the traditional races because they do not want to be put under pressure. Therefore, we have collectively taken the decision that this year we will run Sports Day differently.

On Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> July we will hold Nursery and Reception Sports Day from 9am to about 10.15am. This allows the little children to do activites for them and not be worried about all the big boys and girls out on the field too. Parents of Nursery and Reception are invited to stay and watch.

Then at 10.30am we will have Sports Day for years 1-6. This will follow our normal pattern of sporting events competing for points in classes, with children getting awarded points for their house. These will come to the central score table to be accumulated. Classes will run their traditional races in the week before Sports Day away from the chaos of spectators. These will also be for points, and these will have been handed in before Sports Day so that we can still award the cup on the day to the winning house.

We will still be having a picnic lunch to share with all families, which will take place at appoximately 12.15pm. Parents of children in Nursery or Reception are welcome to meet their children on the field and sit together with friends and family.

At 1pm, all children will return to class for afternoon registration.

At 1.15pm, we will then hold our Open Afternoon, with parents invited to come in and look at your children's work for the year and speak to the class teacher about their reports / go to new classes to meet new teachers. Any children with parents unable to make this will be taken to the school hall to watch a film for the afternoon, supervised by our fantastic TAs.

If you have attended Sports Day and the picnic you will be able to take your child home following your Open Class visit, whatever time you finish your visit. All children without adults on site will be kept until normal going home time. After school club will run as normal, but in the dining room.

Open Class will finish at 4pm.
