Recently at Greenfields...



Please think in advance of what impact your child's absence will have on the school. Equally, we cannot be held responsible if your child misses things like school photos. We work on the assumption that every child will be in school every day, and plan accordingly..


4th July – Guide Dogs Day

Technology at home

I am having to spend more and more of my time talking to children about the impact of their use of technology, websites and apps at home. We have recently had several incidents where arguments or comments made in apps like Whatsapp are spilling into school behaviour and affecting learning. This is not ok, but there is very little I can do to control what happens on devices outside of school. However, this last month I have had to deal with several cases of children logging into each others accounts and 'hacking' each other to affect their TimesTables Rockstars scores. Some are doing this to help their friends, others for not such nice reasons. Either way, the result is that is spoils the algorithms for the children.

TTRS works by analysis the amount of correct answers a player gives and then reinforcing ones they struggle with through extra practice as they go on. This generates 'heat maps' where children who know their tables show as green, and those still learning are red and yellow. The children really like the competition over these heat maps and they are looked at each week in class. However, we have children who have not been exposed to times tables outside of their year group all of a sudden being green in tables not yet covered. This is because siblings or friends are logging in as them and getting their map to green. This means that the next time they log in, the tables will be far too hard for them. It doesn't actually help them.

Equally other children are logging in as friends and sabotaging their heat maps by deliberately getting questions wrong. This means that their work does not progress as the computer constantly gives them the questions they can do, but that someone else is getting wrong on their behalf.

We do ask that apps and games like this are played on at home, but please monitor who your child is logging on as. This information is inside their reading log book or homework diary. Please also talk to them about the importance of online stafety, and only you knowing their log ins. For now it is time stables rockstars, but in the future this will be social media apps, bank accounts etc. What we teach now has life long learning in this respect.

E-Safety does form part of our curriculum every term, and the children know all the right things to say in lessons, but just that small percentage are not living what we teach. Please support us in embedding this message.
