Last week we had the NSPCC in talking to some classes about their Speak Out, Stay Safe campaign. We did assemblies with all classes to share their messages. Please reiterate the information that was sent out to you before half term with the children. Every child has a right to be heard and to be listened to, and every child has a right to be safe. With the younger years we focussed on keeping our body private and the pants rule – if you pants cover it, no-one else should see it. This is so important, as whilst children are naturally inquisitive, they also need to respect each other. We are changing the toilets at Greenfields so that they are 2 individual cubicles in the classrooms, but some children love to go together! We really would appreciate you discussing this at home. With the older children we did talk about the different types of abuse some children experience, and if they ever are made to feel sad or unsafe, they must speak to an adult and seek support from someone they trust. This is becoming more and more important with their increasing use of online platforms.

We had a brilliant visit from local author Steven Vinacour on Tuesday. He shared extracts from his series Ted's Time Travelling Toilet and had us all in giggles at his funny jokes! The books are in school and we will be sharing them with the children in the coming weeks.





Y₄ Swimming

Some schools put swimming in their timetables for a term. We allow up to 2 years of swimming lessons to ensure that as many children learn to swim as possible – it is a skill that could save their life. Children start in the summer term of Y3, go for all of year 4, and then those who still need lessons are able to continue in Y5, whilst those who reach the national curriculum requirement then have their PE lessons using the sports facilities. We are so happy that this year, Y4 have really mastered their skills and we have a big group now working on their life saving skills.

As always, children have been coming in discussing things they see at home, what they are up to and what they have been downloading on YouTube. This week, several children have been talking about watching Sprunki, which sells itself as a fun, creative, interactive engaging game where you chose characters and songs, visual story telling; and sounds delightful. However, there is also a horror version of Sprunki offering more intense game play, blood and gore, and this is the version lots of young children seem to have found. YouTube often appears to be great, but within only a few clicks on the suggestions you can easily access some nasty things.

Children find it hard enough to understand the difference between death, blood guts and gore online and in real life, they really do not need to have it through what pertains to be an innocent cartoon. Please keep an eye on what they are accessing. Once a child has seen something like this, they can't 'un-see' it, and it is upsetting for them, affects behaviour and ultimately happiness.

We have held class elections and voted in councillors for Y3-6 and we meet regularly. There will be visits to Early Years and KS1 to keep them informed and ask for their suggestions.



I am offering tickets to Greenfields early at a reduced price before they go on general sale in South Oxhey, so please reserve your seat as soon as you can.


