## Recently at Greenfields...


It has been back to school at a frantic pace this week – already November and this term is always so busy with the C word fast approaching. I'm already having meetings to discuss the Christmas Play and Concerts (put the dates in your diary now - 11<sup>th</sup> (1.30pm and 5pm) and 12<sup>th</sup> December (9.15am) and working out which carols to practise.

This week most classes have started new topics and learning themes, and what better way to grab their attention than a trip or experience to engage their brains. Y6 went to the Uxbridge Bunker to continue their learning about World War II and see the very bunker which controlled the Battle for Britain. See further on for their account of the trip. Years 3 and Year 5 are out as I type at the Natural History Museum and the Science Museum respectively. Year 2 were meant to have an experience which had to change last minute, and so Mrs Jeffries led an immersive day at school. I appreciate that all trips rely on voluntary contributions. We legally can insist on the entry costs being paid if you would face a cost to take a child yourself, it is the mode of transport that is the voluntary bit. However, I always say if you are experiencing difficulties, please come and see me so we can work out a way forward together. When we do not have enough donations we have to make hard decisions, and as a school I cannot pay for all trips. I also cannot work on parents paying / promising to pay after the trip has happened as we have to pay in advance. You cannot go to a restaurant, eat a meal and then promise to pay next month.

I know the Arbor system is not the easiest as it does not allow you to put multiple things in a cart and check out in bulk, but it does save cards and it does work. Please pay attention to the payment deadline, and please do come and speak to me if there is a problem so we can find a way forward together. I have tried really hard to make pots open as early as possible, to give as much notice as possible about money needed. However, I will make the calls when we cannot go ahead with trips which is disappointing for everyone involved. Currently, pots are open for all Christmas events – fair, grotto and panto. This week I have paid for all the panto tickets, which school is covering, we are asking for contributions towards the cost of the coaches and the refreshment treats.

This week I have been really proud to be showing so many potential families around who are all looking for spaces for their children for September 2025. It is so good that our reputation is such that so many families want to attend Greenfields, and I know this is down in part to the wonderful things you say about us in the local community. My aim has always been for Greenfields to be a school of choice, and finally that appears to be happening. Thank you for the part you are playing in that. Even covered in scaffolding, it is lovely to hear so many strangers saying what a wonderful warm feeling the school has, and how they want to be a part of our community. If you are part of our Nursery and want to attend here in Reception, remember you still need to apply online through Hertfordshire council as we do not run the admissions for Reception.

Attendance is something we began working on when I took over in January 2019, and has always been something I am proud of the improvement. Now it seems we are going back a bit — at a time where we are entering an Ofsted window, and a time where they have announced they will definitely be looking at attendance and lateness. It is the one bit of school I really have no control over, and have to look to you and ask you to help. As you can see — only 3 classes managed to have 'good' attendance last half term, and the week before half term, every class falls into yellow or worse.

I appreciate this time of the year we do have illnesses, but the number of days off with no contact are not acceptable. You must ring us by 9am if a child is going to be off. If we ring and get no answer, we have a duty of care to ensure your child is safe. There have been horrible stories about parents having accidents and children dying because nobody checked, so we are just doing our job. Please do not be cross or rude to the office staff for checking.

We also have many families coming in late. It really impacts you r child when this happens as they miss key learning time, messages and are playing catch up for the rest of the day. Registers are taken at 8.45am and children must be in then. Our doors open at 8.40am. Attendance after 9.15am is Unauthorised, and 10 unauthorised marks in a 10 week rolling period, I now legally have to take action.

Please can we all make a concerted effort to improve this, and together we can make a difference to ensure we keep being a GOOD school.


