High Expectations



- Being an example to other children at all times
 - Uniform (black trainers if trainers are being worn)
 - Behaviour
 - Manners

Uniform

PE kit



PE is on a Tuesday and Friday.

Children should wear <u>PE kit</u> to school on these days

- ▶ Dark coloured shorts and/or tracksuit bottoms
- Trainers
- School house colour T-shirt
- PE shorts (not short shorts)
- Hair will need to be tied back



Attendance



- Avoid absence (unless absolutely necessary) and holidays
- No absence during SATs week (13th 16th May 2024)
- ► If your child is absent please phone school on first day absent where possible and send a note on return
- School starts at 8:40am with tasks set from this time.



Communication



- Please do speak to us through the year about your child or with any questions or concerns you may have
- Please speak to one of the Year 6 team, call the office or send a note with your child if they:
 - have been absent
 - are unable to do PE
 - have a problem with their uniform
 - have a medical/other appointment during school time that can't be rearranged

(please let us know in advance about appointments)

- For other messages/information the homework diary could be used – just remind your child to show us!
- PLEASE CHECK class email regularly



Reminders



- Permission to walk home form needs to be filled in
- Mobile phones only if absolutely necessary
- Only if they walk alone
- Must not be used on the school grounds
- Must be signed in at start & out at end of the school day (box for all valuable items e.g. phones, house keys)
- Bikes and scooters not to be ridden on school grounds
- Equipment needed every day:

 - Spelling book

Homework



- ► Homework for year 6:

 - Children need to read 4 times a week to you
 - They record reading themselves: book name, date, pages read
 - Please ask children questions about what they are reading
 - Online tasks (TTRock Stars, Read Theory, Purple Mash)

Importance of reading with your child



- Reading to your child is one of the most powerful things you can do
- Just 10 minutes a day can make a huge difference to children's academic outcomes
- Reading books for pleasure helps contribute to the wellbeing of children
- Reading the same text supports reading fluency and helps develop and build vocabulary and understanding. Rereading a text gradually increases the number of words children can read 'at a glance'. Children will sound like story tellers and will grow in confidence.
- Look out for the reading with your child booklets, which will be posted on our app



SATs



- ► Test week: 13th 16th May 2023
- Monday English Grammar, punctuation and spelling test
- Tuesday English Reading test
- Wednesday and Thursday Maths one arithmetic paper
 two reasoning papers
- Science tested in sample of schools only
- Writing teacher assessed and moderated based on assessments made across year

How can I help my child?



- Attend school on time and ready to learn
- Regularly discuss your child's learning in all subjects
- Ensure homework is completed support and work with your child where possible/needed
- Encourage additional learning at home:
- Practising x tables and mental maths (e.g. playing card/domino/dice games)
- Share reading experiences with your child and discuss them
- Rehearse spellings and investigate these
- Build vocabulary
- Encourage & support children in exploring extra questions posed in class
- Discuss and explore the world around them
