Recently at Greenfields...

As a baby of the summer of 1976, I grew up knowing that heatwaves existed, but boy – I have never taught through one quite like this before! Thank you all for bearing with us through this incredibly challenging week. Despite County issuing risk assessment after risk assessment about heat, ultimately it came down to our school and how we could manage the rising temperatures, and I hope you feel we did the best we could to keep everyone safe in the sun. We appreciated you picked up hot, sweaty, tired and argumentative children; as you can imagine, a class of 30 of these is not much fun on little to no sleep. Having said that, well done for all our families that did bring their children in. We did have time in the staffroom – air conditioning made that bearable, water fights, non stop hydration breaks and at times classrooms felt like spas, the number that had feet in trays of water to try to keep cool! I honestly think school was cooler than most homes, and the children have been so good about their restrictions on time outside, hats on, no running around etc. It is the future, and one we need to plan for, but well done everyone for surviving the week. The weather breaks this weekend, so on Monday we will expect all children back in normal school uniform and meeting our standards.

Huge well done to go to Y5, Y2 and Y1 classes who all went on trips in this heat, and to the staff who supported them – especially the Y5 team who stayed overnight in the wooden cabins and did day 2 in increasingly hot temperatures. Whilst the trips were hot, we did feel the children would cope and manage with the additional breaks and water we put in place, and would be disappointed if they

got cancelled. It does sound like they have all had a fabulous time.

In school we are slowly beginning to bring learning to an end, and assessments over the next two weeks, after which we move on to transition and end of year activities. Please do put all the dates in your calendar to ensure you know what is happening when. I have sent out a Piota today with the new classes on. Please do tell your children their new teacher for next year. We do not do this in school as it does cause some children distress in moving on, so we would like them to be supported at home in knowing who their next teacher is. The eagle eyes of you will have seen that Y1 next year is being taught by Mrs Cook – which is in fact Miss chopping, who is getting married this summer, so will return under her married name. I will write more about the staff leaving as we get closer to the end of the year.

All staff have a lot of time to hand over their class, to share information and data with the new class teacher and there is also Transition Day on the 9th July, which is so important for all children to attend. We also have Open Class on the 21st June for you to see all the children's work, discuss reports and meet the new class teacher should you wish to introduce yourselves. This takes place from 3.15 – 4pm on the 21st June.
