Recently at Greenfields...

Well, that was certainly an eventful start to the term – but one we were waiting for and we all very ready to rise up to. As you know, we fell into the inspection window again in April, so we knew that Ofsted were on their way at some point, so we have been preparing for their visit for some time, but you never know exactly how an inspection will go.

For those that don't keep up with the press, the style of Ofsted inspections was changed this year following the tragic death of a headteacher, Ruth Parry, who took her life due to the pressure and result of her inspection. Ofsted have since scrapped the single judgement result, and when published, we will be able to share the result of our 7 areas of grading. The result looks a bit like a score card, with judgements given for a variety of themes across the school. The judgements are now no longer best fit, and you have to achieve every single area of every single bullet point to prove you are that standard. We cannot share with you the outcome of the inspection until this report has been written, quality assured and published on the Ofsted website – a process that normally takes about 6 weeks, so we are very much hoping to be able to share out outcome with you before the holidays.

Inspections are a gruelling process – 2 full days with 3 inspectors looking into every facet of school life. It takes staff out of classes, hours of meetings and endless paperwork trails. This week the team that is Greenfields pulled together amazingly and showed that we live up to our mantra of 'Going Above and Beyond'. And that team includes you our families, and certainly our children.

Thank you to everyone who took part in the survey. Whilst we do not get to see the results, the inspectors do share some comments with us, and I would like to thank you for the many positive comments about different areas of the school. Mrs Evans and I were so proud of all the lovely things you have said. I have shared what I can remember with the staff and passed on your lovely words (the ones we knew about, but we were told there were many, many more!)

The children are the true stars as always. And they shone. I am so proud of their maturity in speaking to the inspection team, their passion about their learning, their retention of the knowledge they have been taught, and their behaviour in classes. That absolutely shone through – just how everyone was engaged in their learning. We do what we can to help them achieve, but in the end, it comes down to each individual child and their determination to shine. I could not have asked them to glow any more brightly!

Bizarrely, this week has coincided with a message from Hertfordshire's MIX92.6 radio show, to tell us that on Wednesday 10th of June we will be the school featured in their 'Random School Selector'. A shout out to Greenfields will go out on air at around 8.20am. Please do try to tune in if you can to hear it!

Here's to a peaceful and restful end of the year and a fabulous last half term!

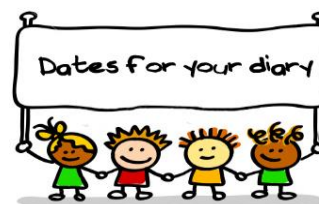
